All pavement cuts to be backfilled with CDF, pavement replacement shall meet the Village of Amanda pavement restoration specifications. Right-of-way to be backfilled with 304 aggregate. Traffic warning signals to be placed during construction. Lights required at night, flags/signs required during daylight.

Backfill each day, secure open cuts with safety fence, lights, metal travel plates, etc, all or one when needed. Secure all equipment at the end of each work day, travel route of hauling dirt, etc. All to be per Village permission.

For projects incorporating more than one individual residential lot, or for all commercial and/or industrial projects, a maintenance bond or security in the amount of the estimated project costs must be deposited with the Village's Clerk-Treasurer before any pavement or sidewalk is disturbed.

Approval of work in the right-of-way does not include a review of the proposed work. Plan review must be completed by the Village Engineer.

VILLAGE OF AMANDA CONTRACTOR REGISTRATION

Effective October , 2011 the Village of Amanda requires contractor registration. This includes any individual or company who is engaged in the business as a general contractor, sub-contractor, and/or project manager, or who provides construction activities such as general construction, repair, renovation, electrical, plumbing, heating and/or cooling, water line or sewer line installation within the municipal limits of the Village of Amanda. **Please note that property owners or residents performing work themselves are not required to register.**

When registering with the Village of Amanda, the following items are required:

1. Completed application;
2. Proof of current certificate of liability insurance with a minimum coverage of \$100,000.00/\$300,000.00 bodily injury and \$50,000.00 property damage;
3. A copy of a current Certificate of Worker's Compensation (when the applicant employs one or more people);
4. A copy of the state license for electric, plumbing and heating and/or cooling registration for commercial projects (as required by House Bill 434);
5. Payment of \$50.00 for the initial registration fee or \$25.00 for the annual renewal fee.
6. Completed Amanda Income Tax form.

Please remember to provide the village with renewal insurance and worker's compensation information at the time of renewal. Otherwise, the registration is no longer valid.

All registrations expire on December 31 of each year. All current registered contractors will be sent a renewal packer each November. If you have any questions contact Ralph Martin at 740-969-4771 or villageofamanda@hotmail.com

Any person who shall fail to comply with any of the provisions of this code shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction, fined not more than five hundred (\$500.00) dollars.

CONTRACTORS REQUIRING REGISTRATION

1. Electrical Contractor: Any person who is engaged in the business, or who, pursuant to written or oral agreement with another person, undertakes any electrical work or portion involving that particular trade, art or craft.
2. Mechanical Contractor: Any person who is engaged in the business, or who, pursuant to written or oral agreement with another person, undertakes any heating and air conditioning work or portion involving that particular trade, art or craft.
3. Plumbing Contractor: Any person who is engaged in the business, or who, pursuant to written or oral agreement with another person, undertakes any plumbing work or portion involving that particular trade, art or craft.
4. General Contractor: Any person who is engaged in the business, or who, pursuant to written or oral agreement with another person, acts as a general contractor or project manager or portion involving that particular trade, art or craft.
5. Water/Sewer Lines Installer: Any person who is engaged in the business, or who, pursuant to written or oral agreement with another person, undertakes any water and/or sewer line installation work or portion involving that particular trade, art or craft.

EXEMPTIONS:

The following are not required to be registered:

- A. The property owner or resident who performs the work him or herself.
- B. Work done or caused to be done by the United States of America, the State of Ohio, or any agency or subdivision.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

Upon receipt of a Contractor Registration Application and recommendation by the Village Administrator may issue a registration certificate in accordance with regulations established by the Village of Amanda. However, it shall not be mandatory that the Village Administrator issue a registration certificate should it be established to their satisfaction that the applicant in question has been of any of the acts or practices for which registration certificate could be revoked as set forth.

All registration certificates shall expire on the 31st day of December of the year for which the same was issued. No registration fee required shall be refunded for any cause whatsoever.

No registration certificate shall be issued or continue in effect unless the applicant shall give evidence that the following items are valid and remain in effect during the duration of the registration certificate:

- A. The prepayment of fifty (\$50.00) dollars registration fee or renewal payment of twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars to the Village of Baltimore.
- B. Public liability and property damage insurance with the minimum coverage of \$100,000.00/\$300,000.00 bodily injury and \$50,000.00 property damage.
- C. A Certificate of Worker's Compensation, when the applicant employees one (1) or more people.
- D. Applicant must be eighteen (18) years of age or older.
- E. Copy of State License for electric, plumbing, and heating and/or cooling registrations for commercial projects (effective September 17, 2001 per State House Bill 434).

Note: A current copy liability insurance, certificate of Worker's Compensation and state license, if applicable, must be submitted and kept on file in the Village of Amanda, or registration is void. (This is the responsibility of the Contractor.)

This registration form, along with the payment of fifty (\$50.00) dollars registration fee, or twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars renewal fee, must be delivered to this office no later than January 31 of each year to remain active. Renewals received after January 31 will be treated as new registrations and will be charged fifty (\$50.00) dollars.

REVOCA TION OF REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE

Upon written complaint of any person, the Village Administrator will investigate the complaint, and may recommend to the Safety Committee of Council to revoke, modify or suspend any registration certificate issued pursuant to the provisions of this chapter. This includes acts or omissions of the holder of any such certificate; conversion of property or funds belonging to another, failure to complete any contract or work undertaken under the this registration, unreasonable delay in the completion of work performed, use of unapproved or fraudulent material, involuntary petition of bankruptcy by registration certificate holder, or unauthorized departure from plans or specifications agreed to by certificate holder and owner. The Safety Committee shall then make a final determination as to the action to be taken. The Village Administrator will notify the contractor of the action taken by the committee. However, no registration certificate shall be revoked without at least fifteen (15) days advance written notice by the Village Administrator to the registration certificate holder and allowance of appeal submitted in writing stating the reason for the appeal. Appeal is to be filed with the Village Administrator within ten (10) days of receipt of notice of revocation.

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING, ADOPTING AND ENACTING THE 2012 EDITION OF THE MODEL OHIO MUNICIPAL CODE – ADMINISTRATION CODE, AS REVISED THROUGH JULY 28, 2011, PUBLISHED BY AMERICAN LEGAL PUBLISHING FOR THE VILLAGE OF _____, OHIO; REPEALING ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS IN CONFLICT THEREWITH; PUBLISHING THE ENACTMENT OF NEW MATTER; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, American Legal Publishing Corporation has prepared and published a Model Ohio Municipal Code – Administration Code, as revised through July 28, 2011, which components are based upon and consistent with State law through July 28, 2011; and

WHEREAS, the Village is in need of a codification of such legislation, with which to administer the affairs of the Village, ensure law and order and avoid practical and legal entanglements; and

WHEREAS, Article XVIII, Section 3, of the Ohio Constitution requires that Village law be in conformity with State law in those areas specified therein;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF _____, OHIO:

SECTION 1. The 2012 Edition of the Model Ohio Municipal Code – Administration Code, as published by American Legal Publishing Corporation, is hereby approved, adopted and enacted by and for the Village.

SECTION 2. One book-form copy of the 2012 Edition of this Model Ohio Municipal Code – Administration Code shall be attached to this ordinance as a part hereof and filed with the permanent ordinance records of the Village.

SECTION 3. All ordinances and resolutions or parts thereof which are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of the 2012 Edition of the Model Ohio Municipal Code – Administration Code, as adopted in Section 1 hereof, are hereby repealed as of the effective date of this ordinance, except as follows:

- A. The enactment of the 2012 Edition of the Model Ohio Municipal Code – Administration Code shall not be construed to affect a right or liability accrued or incurred under any legislative provision prior to the effective date of such enactment, or an action or proceeding for the enforcement of such right or liability. Such enactment shall not be construed to relieve any person from punishment for an act committed in violation of any such legislative provision, nor to affect an indictment or prosecution therefor. For such purposes, any such legislative provision shall continue in full force notwithstanding its repeal for the purpose of revision and codification.
- B. The repeal provided above shall not affect:
 - (1) The grant or creation of a franchise, license, right, easement or privilege;
 - (2) The purchase, sale, lease or transfer of property;
 - (3) The appropriation or expenditure of money or promise or guarantee of payment;
 - (4) The assumption of any contract or obligation;
 - (5) The issuance and delivery of any bonds, obligations or other instruments of indebtedness;
 - (6) The levy or imposition of taxes, assessments or charges;
 - (7) The establishment, naming, vacating or grade level of any street or public way;
 - (8) The dedication of property or plat approval;
 - (9) The annexation or detachment of territory;
 - (10) Any legislation enacted subsequent to the adoption of this ordinance.

SECTION 4. Pursuant to Ohio R.C. 731.21, 731.22 and 731.23, the Clerk of Council shall cause to be published a notice of the enactment of this ordinance, containing the title of the ordinance and a summary of the new matters covered by it, which summary is attached hereto and marked "Exhibit A."

SECTION 5. Whenever reference is made in any documents, publications, or signs of the municipality, including but not limited to traffic tickets and traffic-control signs, to a section as it existed in a former edition of the Model Ohio Municipal Code, the reference shall extend and apply to the section referred to as subsequently amended, revised, recodified, or renumbered.

SECTION 6. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, such emergency existing by reason of the necessity of providing a Municipal Code that is consistent with the latest State law, as required by the Ohio Constitution, and this ordinance, including the 2012 Edition of the Model Ohio Municipal Code – Administration Code adopted hereby, shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage by at least two-thirds of all members elected to Council, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

SECTION 2. One book-form copy of the 2012 Edition of this Model Ohio Municipal Code – General Offenses Code shall be attached to this ordinance as a part hereof and filed with the permanent ordinance records of the Village.

SECTION 3. All ordinances and resolutions or parts thereof which are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of the 2012 Edition of the Model Ohio Municipal Code – General Offenses Code, as adopted in Section 1 hereof, are hereby repealed as of the effective date of this ordinance, except as follows:

- A. The enactment of the 2012 Edition of the Model Ohio Municipal Code – General Offenses Code shall not be construed to affect a right or liability accrued or incurred under any legislative provision prior to the effective date of such enactment, or an action or proceeding for the enforcement of such right or liability. Such enactment shall not be construed to relieve any person from punishment for an act committed in violation of any such legislative provision, nor to affect an indictment or prosecution therefor. For such purposes, any such legislative provision shall continue in full force notwithstanding its repeal for the purpose of revision and codification.
- B. The repeal provided above shall not affect:
 - (1) The grant or creation of a franchise, license, right, easement or privilege;
 - (2) The purchase, sale, lease or transfer of property;
 - (3) The appropriation or expenditure of money or promise or guarantee of payment;
 - (4) The assumption of any contract or obligation;
 - (5) The issuance and delivery of any bonds, obligations or other instruments of indebtedness;
 - (6) The levy or imposition of taxes, assessments or charges;
 - (7) The establishment, naming, vacating or grade level of any street or public way;
 - (8) The dedication of property or plat approval;
 - (9) The annexation or detachment of territory;
 - (10) Any legislation enacted subsequent to the adoption of this ordinance.

SECTION 4. Pursuant to Ohio R.C. 731.21, 731.22 and 731.23, the Clerk of Council shall cause to be published a notice of the enactment of this ordinance, containing the title of the ordinance and a summary of the new matters covered by it, which summary is attached hereto and marked "Exhibit A."

SECTION 5. Whenever reference is made in any documents, publications, or signs of the municipality, including but not limited to traffic tickets and traffic-control signs, to a section as it existed in a former edition of the Model Ohio Municipal Code, the reference shall extend and apply to the section referred to as subsequently amended, revised, recodified, or renumbered.

SECTION 6. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, such emergency existing by reason of the necessity of providing a Municipal Code that is consistent with the latest State law, as required by the Ohio Constitution, and this ordinance, including the 2012 Edition of the Model Ohio Municipal Code – General Offenses Code adopted hereby, shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage by at least two-thirds of all members elected to Council, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.





SUBJECT: **Residential Handicapped Parking Policy**
Effective Date: **November 1, 2012**
Pages 1 of 3

1. APPLICABILITY:

This policy shall be applicable to any person requesting an on-street residential parking space to be reserved exclusively for handicapped individuals. Residential handicapped parking spaces that were established prior to effective date of this policy shall be grandfathered without fee until such time as request is modified by the applicant.

2. PURPOSE:

- A. The Village recognizes that
1. On-street parking in some residential neighborhoods is a limited resource, especially in areas having
 - a) Few off street parking facilities, e.g., parking spaces; garages; driveways; and/or
 - b) Multi-family housing units
 2. Under the Village's Zoning ordinances, landlords are responsible for providing adequate parking for multi-family dwellings; AND
 3. The mobility for some citizens can be enhanced by the establishment of reserved parking spaces along public streets for registered handicapped individuals;
- B. The purpose of this document is to establish guidelines for designation of a parking space reserved for handicapped individuals in a residential area that recognizes and balances these issues.

3. GENERAL:

- A. Handicapped parking spaces established by the Village are for the use of any individual displaying a handicapped license tag or a BMV-issued handicapped hangtag. The space is **NOT** reserved for the individual requesting the handicapped space.
- B. It shall be the policy of the Village of Amanda to establish a reserved handicapped parking space on a public street if **ALL** items 1-4 **OR** item 5 apply:
1. A vehicle belonging in the household has a valid license tag with the handicapped symbol or a valid BVM-issued card for the handicapped; and
 2. The address requested is for single-family residence; and
 3. The address requested does not have a driveway; and
 4. No off-street parking is available; and
 5. Available off-street parking space would provide worse access than on-street parking (e.g.; more vertical steps) as determined by the Village Administrator
- C. Only one (1) reserved handicapped parking space will be permitted per address.

4. PROCEDURES

- A. A Formal request for a reserved handicapped space shall be submitted to the Village Administrator through normal business communications
1. In writing:
Village of Amanda
Village Administrator
PO Box 250
Amanda, Ohio 43102
- B. Written request shall include the following:
1. The address of the location requested
 2. The handicapped license plate or the handicapped hang-tag number expiration Date on the card
 3. The name of the handicapped individual in the household in whose name the License or hang tag has been issued
 4. Contact information of the person requesting the reserved space, including name Address and phone number.

5. INSTALLATION RATE:

- A. The estimated cost of installing the signage for a single residential handicapped parking space exceeds \$150 in 2011;
- B. The Street Department sole recovery for a portion of this cost will be by the collection of the fee(s) as per the **Amanda Fees Schedule**
- C. Residential handicapped parking spaces that were established prior to effective date of this policy shall be grandfathered without fee until such time as the request is modified by the applicant, or if the signs and/or posts need to be replaced due to normal wear and tear.

6. APPEALS:

If the applicant disagrees with the decision of the Village Administrator of the Village of Amanda, appeals may be made to the Village Council 116 E Main St Amanda, OH 43102, (740) 969-4771. Decisions made by the Administrator shall be final.
