

To The Village Council Of Amanda

It is very apparent that the majority of the citizens of Amanda want to continue the police protection offered by Police Chief Muck and his two deputies. Police Chief Muck, has advised that he and the two deputies can provide sound adequate protection if allowed a total of 120 man hours per month (fourty hours per This would result in monthly salaries of \$620.00 or less. man). A total of \$4,960 more for the remaining 8 months of 1984. This means that the village will need to put an additional amount of \$4,775 in the wages and salaries portion of the police fund. The contractual services (phone) and other operation and maintenance funds are now showing a total balance of \$1146.03. Allowing \$100.00 per month for opperations and maintenance (supplies and cruiser expenses) and \$39.00 per month for the three phones, there will be no need to increase this portion of the police budget. The 1984 budget for the police department was set in November of 1983, salaries and wages \$1500.00, contractual services \$250.00 other operations and maintenance \$1439.00 totaling \$3,189.20 which was the balance of the police fund as of December 31, 1983. Through April the expenses for this department was \$1857.97 with \$185.00 left in salaries/wages portion. This means that \$1,315.00 was spent in the first four months on wages and salaries which figures to be less than 260 police man hours. This is an average of less than 15.5 man hours per week. Given that there are 168 hours in a week the total paid police hours protection average has been less than 9.3% of This, I feel is totally inadequate. the time.

Given that the general fund has a balance of \$13824.58 with an additional income of over \$9,000.00 coming in this year in property taxes and over \$2,000.00 coming in this year from estate taxes and over \$6,000.00 more coming in income taxes now, which will give the general fund a total of over \$30,824.00, I would think that it would be in the extreme best interest of the Village for the Council to reappropriate from the general fund the additional monies needed to maintain our police department for the remainder of the year.

This transfer of funds can be simply done by filing an amended d certificate of estimated resources with the county **aud**itor.

It is also legal to gain additional funding from donations throughout the year and use them for village opperations within the same year. I for one would be very happy to provide a very generous donation to be used for police funding if council, after its serious analysis of the general fund budget, determines that it cannot afford to use the general fund monies to extend the critically needed police protection in this town.

Last year's general fund expenditures were \$30,858.00 of which a total of \$6,745.97 was used for police protection. So far this year no money from the gereral fund has been used for police protection.

Action must be taken now to prevent the loss of the talent we have in the department and all the money it took to train and equip them. We don't have the time or the money to start all over again.
