Mayor Fatman submitted his annual report as follows: To the Council of the Village of Amanda Ohio. The past year has been in many ways a progressive one for our village, improvements in streets, side walks and buildings have been made, but few of the ordinances have been violated and all offenders have been punished, except in the case of the violation of Ordinance No. XVII. requiring the paving of the side walks on East Main Street.

The following is a statement of all monies collected by me, said Mayor, and paid to the Treas. viz

I would recommend the enforcement of ordinance No. XVII and resolutions requiring the paving of side walks on East Main Street, and also recommend the paving of side walks on the West side of East Street, from Church or South Street to first alley north of High Street, and to complete the paving of the side walks on the West side of Centre Street from the terminal of Ballhuser's paving to High Street. And further I would recommend some means of Fire Protection for the village. I want to return to the council my sincere thanks for the faithful services rendered me during my administration. We have not accomplished all that we desired but I feel that we have put forth an honest effort, and done the best we could, and now as our official relations are severed, I do not expect to lose my interest in the ^{welfare of our} village, I would.

The appointments of Jurymen were approved. The following resolution was presented and adopted by a unanimous vote. Be it resolved by the Council of the Village of Amanda Fairfield County, Ohio that a sidewalk be established from the South side of North street to the North side of South or Church street on the West side of East street. The width of said sidewalk to be seven feet and paved with brick stone or cement 4 feet wide and said paving to be 18 inches from curb and said paving to be completed on or before Oct 1st 1906.

Also the following resolution was adopted by unanimous vote. Be it resolved by the Council of the Village of Amanda Fairfield County Ohio that the said Council deems it necessary that the property owners abutting the street named below pave and curb the west side of Main st to the South side of North street. Said pavement to be not less than four feet wide; out edge to be eighteen inches from curb line to be made of good brick cement or stone; the curbing to be not less than five inches thick. Said pavement to be completed on or before Oct 1st 1906.

also. Be it resolved by the Council of the Village of Amanda Fairfield Co. Ohio that the Council deems it necessary that the pavement on the South side of Main street be extended by the property owners abutting said street from the East side of Mrs Stowards property to the west side of Lutz street.
