and Billiard tables and the places wherein such tables
are kept, in the village of Amanda in Fairfield County
and State of Ohio. Be it ordained
by the council of the village of Amanda Fairfield

unlawful for any person or persons owning or oper-
ating a Pool or Billiard room in said village. To

der the age of eighteen years, (18 yrs) to play at such

persons to play at the game of pool or billiards or at any other game for money or any other thing of value or to suffer any game of chance or gain of whatever name or nature to be played in said pool or billiard room or to play any slot machine of any nature in said room or place or in any room directly connected therewith.

Section 4. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to cause permit or allow any place where on other days of the week than the first commonly called Sunday, pool or billiards are played, to be or remain open except between the hours of six thirty (6³⁰) o'clock a.m. and nine (9) o'clock p.m. (central standard time).

Section 5. Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of the preceding sections of this ordinance shall on conviction thereof be fined for the first offense. Twenty Dollars, (\$20.00) and the costs of prosecution, and for each succeeding offense. Fifty Dollars, (\$50.00) and costs of prosecution.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AUCTIONEERSLICENSE NECESSARY - PUBLIC AUCTION

Section 6. Save as to sales under judicial processes, and exceptions granted by Section 5866 of the Ohio Code, it shall be unlawful for any person, co-partnership, corporation or association, to sell, dispose of, or offer for sale in the City of Lancaster, at public auction, any merchandise, whether the same be their property or whether they sell or offer the same for sale as agents, unless a license therefor is issued for such sale; such license to be issued by the Mayor of the City of Lancaster. (No. 1335, March 9, 1931)

APPLICATION

Section 7. All applications for such licenses shall be in writing and filed with the Mayor of the City of Lancaster 60 days previous to the commencement of such sale; that the applicant has been in continuous business in the City of Lancaster as a retail or wholesale merchant for a period of one year preceding such application; that such applicant shall have owned the goods to be sold, for a period of one month prior thereto; that such applicant tender with the application a bond in a sum not to exceed \$2500.00 conditional for the observance of this ordinance and for the indemnification of any purchaser at such auction sale for suffering loss upon proof by reason of misrepresentation; that such applicant consents to the forfeiture of license and bond in the event of conviction of a violation of this ordinance. (No. 1335, March 9, 1931)

CONDUCT OF SALE - INVENTORY MUST BE FILED, etc.

Section 8. All auction sales shall be held on successive days, Sundays and legal holidays excepted. Satisfactory evidence shall be submitted to the Mayor that the property proposed to be sold is a bona fide part of the applicants stock in trade and was not secured, purchased or brought into said place of business for, or in anticipation of such sale. It shall be unlawful for any person during progress of any auction sale to replenish his stock by substitutions, fill-ins or goods of any character. On the day preceding the commencement of any such auction sale the license shall file with the Mayor a complete inventory of stock to be sold; and at the close of each days business and before the opening of next days sale the licensee shall file with the Mayor an itemized list of the articles sold on the previous days sale, which list shall identify such articles on the inventory. Failure to file such sales list shall be deemed a violation of this ordinance and the right to conduct further sales under such license, shall be suspended during such delinquency. (No. 1335 Mar. 9, 1931)

BY-BIDDING PROHIBITED

Section 9. It shall be unlawful for any person to act or to employ another to act as a by-bidder or what is commonly known as a "capper" or "booster" at any such auction sale, or to make or accept any false or misleading bid, or to pretend to buy or sell any articles sold or offered for sale at any such auction sale. (No. 133 Mar. 9, 1931)

MAYOR'S AUTHORITY

Section 10. Authority is vested with the Mayor of the City of Lancaster, Ohio insofar as; the granting and revoking of licenses, the time such auction sale may be held, and the length of time of such sale, subject to Section 5 of this chapter. No. 1335 Mar. 9, 1931)

ANIMALS

Section 10A. Auctioneer of live or domestic animal or animals, for each day, shall pay not less than One Dollar (\$1.00), nor more than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) or One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per annum.

PEDDLERS

LICENSE REQUIRED PENALTY

Section 49. Provided, further, that nothing in this ordinance contained, shall be construed to prohibit the possession, custody or control of the above named articles by wholesale dealers when held in transit, or for sale and delivery to points outside the village of Amanda, Ohio.

Section 2 That any person for himself or as an agent for any other person, firm or Corporation, violating the provisions shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not less than \$100 ten Dollars nor more than \$1000 One thousand Dollars.

Granting to The Buckeye Gas Company, its successors and assigns, the right to acquire all and singular the gas distributing plant and property of the Crook Gas Company, within the Village of Amanda, Ohio, together with the right to lay, bury, maintain, operate, extend, repair, and remove or relay mains and pipes, in through, and under the streets, lanes, avenues, bridges and public grounds of the village of Amanda, Ohio, for the purpose of distributing and supplying natural gas for heating, lighting and other purposes, and fixing the price to be charged for such gas for the period of five years.

Be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Amanda, State of Ohio:

Section 1. That The Buckeye Gas Company, its successors and assigns, is hereby granted the privilege, and invested with the right to acquire all and singular the gas distributing plant and property of the Crook Gas Company, within the village of Amanda, together with the right to lay, bury, maintain, operate, extend, repair, remove or re-lay, all mains, pipes, service pipes and other appliances necessary and convenient for the successful distribution of natural gas, in through, and under the streets, lanes, alleys, avenues, bridges and public grounds of the said village, together with the right to construct, maintain, repair, replace and remove all necessary regulators, valves, curb boxes, and other appliances; and to convey through the pipes and appliances, so laid and maintained, or which may hereafter be laid and maintained, under the provisions of this ordinance, natural gas for heating, and other purposes for the use of the said village and its inhabitants.

Section 2. All excavations made in the streets, lanes, avenues or public grounds of the said village, for the purpose of laying mains and pipes or other appliances, shall be done to the satisfaction of the proper authorities of the Village, and, upon the completion of the necessary work, the said streets, lanes, alleys, avenues and public grounds, including pavements and sidewalks, shall be restored as nearly as possible to the former condition of usefulness. No excavation in any street, lane, alley avenue or public ground shall be permitted

the necessary curb-boxes and meters, shall be furnished and installed without expense to the consumer. Street mains shall be extended whenever one (1) consumer is assured for each one hundred (100) feet of extension, and provided the available supply of gas is sufficient for the purpose required.

Section 4. The maximum price which the said The Buckeye Gas Company, its successors and assigns, shall be permitted to charge for, and the minimum price at which it shall be required to furnish natural gas to the Village of Amanda and its inhabitants for domestic or gas engine purposes, during the full period of two (2) years, from and after the passage and acceptance of this ordinance, shall be, and the same is hereby fixed at thirty-five (35) cents per one thousand (1000) cubic feet with a discount of three (3c) cents per one thousand (1000) cubic feet, if paid on or before the 10th day of each and every month, succeeding the month in which the said gas was used; and, for a second period of three (3) years from and after the expiration of the first period of two (2) years, from the date of such passage and acceptance, the maximum price which the said The Buckeye Gas Company, its successors, and assigns, shall be permitted to charge for, and the minimum price at which it shall be required to furnish natural gas to the Village of Amanda and its inhabitants for domestic or gas engine purposes, shall be, and the same is hereby fixed at thirty-eight (38c) cents per one thousand (1000) cubic feet, with a discount of three (3c) cents per one thousand (1000) cubic feet, if paid on or before the 10th day of each and every month, succeeding the month in which the said gas was used; and at the end of the said period of five (5) years, as herein specified, this franchise and rate ordinance shall end and determine.

The said, The Buckeye Gas Company, its successors and assigns, shall furnish and install all meters free of cost to the consumer. Making the Little Farm Pay

By C. C. BOWSFIELD

Owners of small farms have taken up the question of beef production. There is a decided movement in favor of meat animals in the central west, and the educational effort now going forward is bound to have a good effect.

This is a profitable branch of farming in more ways than one. Meat values are on such a high basis that farmers can more than double their money on beef where they raise their own stock. Beef raising disposes of fodder and grain to the best advantage, keeps up soil fertility and adds a large cash income to the revenues of the farm.

"I saved \$7 on every calf I raised for the baby beef feed lot last year," said L. D. White of Union county, Ia. "Besides, they had more quality, more ability to lay on fat and more feeding capacity than any I could buy."

The owner of a small farm who has equipped his place with a silo and established a field of alfalfa can profitably handle a carload of beef cattle every year. If he cannot breed so many on the place he is always able

the market will astonish many farmers who do not know the demand for high quality baby beef and the profit there is in supplying it.

The small farmers of the central west only need to look into the matter of concentrated feeding to realize that they are able to take advantage of the high prices for meat animals. It will pay to restrict the pastures and depend more on alfalfa, silage, roots and concentrated feeds. More can be accomplished on a farm of 50 to 100 acres than is generally understood. The problem is one of management. The opportunity is one of the most attractive that American farmers have ever had presented to them. If they believe in diversity and in business farming one of the first steps they should take is to engage in beef production up to the full capacity of their land.

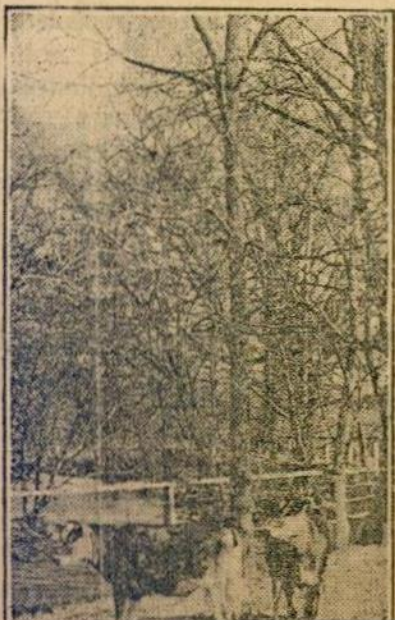

Ordinance #68.

Granting to The Cuckey Gas Co, its successors and assigns, the right to acquire all and singular the gas distributing plant and property of The Crock Gas Company, within the village of Amanda, together with the right to lay, bury, maintain, operate, extend, repair, and remove or relay mains and pipes, in thorough, and under the streets, lanes, avenues, bridges, and public grounds of the village of Amanda, O. for the purpose of distributing, and supplying natural gas for heating, lighting and other purposes, and fixing the price to be charged for such gas for the period of five years.

Be it Ordained by The Council of the Village of Amanda, State of Ohio; -

Sec 1 - That The Cuckey Gas Co, its successors and assigns, be hereby granted the privilege and invested with the right to acquire all and singular the gas distributing plant and property of The Crock Gas Co. within the Village of Amanda, together with the right to lay, bury, maintain, operate, extend, repair, and remove or relay, all mains, pipe service pipes, and other appurtenances necessary and convenient for the successful distribution of natural Gas, in, through, and under the streets, lanes, alleys, avenues, bridges and public grounds of the said Village, together with the right to construct, maintain, repair, replace and remove all necessary regulators, valves, curb-bots and other appliances. And to convey through the pipes and appliances so laid and maintained, or which may hereafter be laid and maintained, under the provisions of this Ordinance, natural gas for heating, and other purposes for the use of the said Village and its inhabitants;

Sec 2 - All excavations made in the streets, lanes, avenues, or public grounds of the said Village, for the purpose of laying mains, and pipes or other appliances, shall be done to the satisfaction of the proper authorities of the Village, and upon the completion of the necessary work, the said streets, lanes, alleys, avenues, and public grounds, including pavements and sidewalks, shall be restored as natural as possible.

to the former condition of usefulness. No excavation in any street, lane, Alley, Avenue or public ground shall be permitted to remain open for a longer period than may be reasonably necessary to complete the work. All mains, pipes, and appliances shall be so laid as not to interfere in any way with any sewer, gas or water pipes, or the pipes of any person, firm or corporation, now laid in such streets, lanes, Alleys, Avenues, or public grounds, in the construction, operation, maintenance or removal of the said mains, pipes or other appliances. The said The Dickey & Gas Co its successors, and assigns, shall save and hold the said Village of Amanda, free and harmless from any and all claims & for damages, or expenses, arising from or caused by its fault or negligence.

Sec III It is further the said The Dickey & Gas Co, its successors, and assigns, shall have street mains laid, and in operation in the streets of said Village, as heretofore provided, it shall make connections therewith, and lay service pipe to the curb line for the furnishing of gas, to any consumer owning or occupying property abutting said curb, whenever such consumer makes application to use gas, and agree to pay for such gas at least the minimum rate specified herein. All the service line to the curb, and the necessary curb-tops, and meters, shall be furnished and installed without expense to the consumer. Street mains shall be extended to him or (1)^{ft} Consumer is assessed for each one Hundred feet (100) of extension, as and provided the available supply of gas is sufficient for the purpose required.

Sec IV The maximum price which the said The Dickey & Gas Co its successors, and assigns, shall be permitted to charge for, and the minimum price at which it shall be required to furnish natural gas to the Village of Amanda, Ohio, and its inhabitants for domestic or gas engine purposes, during the full period of two (2) years, from and after the passage and acceptance of this Ordinance, shall be. And the same is hereby fixed at thirty-five (35) cents per one thousand feet (1000) cubic feet, if paid on or before the 10th day of each, and every month, succeeding the month in
over

which the said gas was used. And for a second period of three (3) years, from the date of such passage and acceptance, the maximum price which the said The Buckeye Gas Co. its successors, and assigns, shall be permitted to charge for, and the minimum price at which it shall be required to furnish natural gas to the Village of Amundea, and its inhabitants for domestic or gas engine purposes, shall be, and the same is hereby fixed at thirty eight (38) cents per thousand (1000) cubic feet, with a discount of three (3) cents per one thousand (1000) cubic feet, if paid on or before the 10th day of each and every month, commencing month in which the said gas was used; and at the end of the said period of five (5) years, as herein specified, this franchise and rate ordinance shall end and determine.

The said The Buckeye Gas Co. its successors, and assigns shall furnish and install all meters free of cost to the consumer. The quantity of gas delivered to consumers shall be ascertained by meter measurement. And the quantity recorded by the meter shall be final and conclusive upon the Gas Company, and the consumer, except when such meter is found defective or ceases to register, in which case, while the meter shall be repairing, or replaced, the quantity of Gas delivered, shall be ascertained by the average of two other meters or by the amount delivered during a previous or corresponding period.

In the event that any consumer shall use no gas during any month, or less than 2000 Two Thousand cubic feet in any month, said The Buckeye Gas Co. its successors, and assigns shall be permitted to charge such consumer for said month, the maximum price herein fixed for Two Thousand (2000) Cubic feet.

Sec 4 Commercial and industrial use. The said The Buckeye Gas Co. its successors and assigns, shall also be authorized and permitted to sell for Commercial and industrial purposes, such natural gas as it may have available from time to time in excess of all domestic gas engine and similar requirements. and the rate or rates to be charged for natural gas sold for such purposes,

shall be controlled by the said, The Buckeye Gas Co, its successors and assigns. But in no case shall such rates be more than is charged for domestic use and gas engine purposes, as provided herein.

The said, The Buckeye Gas Co, its successors and assigns, shall have the right to change, modify, or withdraw any or all such rates and surcharges for Commercial and industrial purposes at any time, upon giving notice of its desire so to do, as provided in the Contracts executed with the said commercial or industrial consumers. In the event of a shortage in the supply of the natural Gas, domestic consumers and gas engine users shall be preferred.

Sec VI Both parties hereto mutually agree that the production of natural gas from wells, and the conveyance of it over long distances is subject to accidents, interruptions, diminutions, and failures, and the consumption varies greatly with the weather, and that The Buckeye Gas Co does not by this contract undertake to furnish to consumers in the said Village a full and uninterrupted delivery of gas for the period named herein, but only to furnish such quantities, and at such pressure, as the pipe line system from which it procures its supply of gas is reasonably capable of delivering. And the said The Buckeye Gas Co, shall not be held responsible for any loss, damages, or injury sustained by the said Village or its inhabitants, and resulting, directly or indirectly, from any shortage, interruption or diminution in the supply or pressure of gas from the said pipe line system.

Sec VII That an Ordinance # 60, granting a franchise to John D. Crook Co or Crook Gas Co, By the said Village of Amanda, passed June 3rd 1912, And as amended Nov 5th 1915, And as further amended Nov. 22-1915, Be and the same is hereby repealed.

Sec VIII That this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage, legal publication, and its acceptance by The Buckeye Gas Co.

Sec. IX - In connection with the natural gas rate Ordinance, The said Buckeye Gas Co, on the 7th day of August, 1916, that there were certain verbal agreements or concessions agreed to by Mr. D. J. Rogers, which were not included in the Ordinance are as follows: -

I The Buckeye Gas Co will pay into the Village Treasury the sum of Twenty-Five (25.00) Dollars per annum, in semiannual payments, to partly compensate the Village of Amanda for the expense of turning off street lights each day at dawn and turning on the said lights each day at dusk.

II There will be no minimum charge applied to gas use by the Village in the Town Hall Building.

III In case any consumer is absent for a week making month, and wishes to depart, to notify the local officer, requesting that, during such absence the gas be turned off. No minimum charge will be made for such period.

IV The Buckeye Gas Co will pay for the publication of this Ordinance.

The foregoing agreements are hereby confirmed and approved.

HOME ECONOMICS WORKER OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY

Practical Home Maker of Much Ex-

Ordinance No. 69

Granting to the Scioto Valley Traction Company of Columbus, Ohio, their successors and assigns, the right to use the streets, lanes, alleys, sidewalks and other public ways and places within the incorporated village of Amanda, Ohio to construct and maintain and operate an electric lighting and power distributing system, as hereinafter provided.

Be it ordained by the Council of the Incorporated Village of

Section 3. Said The Scioto Valley Traction Company, their successors and assigns, shall hold the Village of Amanda harmless as against all damages for personal or other injuries that may result from or grow out of the construction, operation, or maintenance of said electrical distributing system, provided, the said The Scioto Valley Traction Company, their successors and assigns, shall be forthwith and within ten days from the filing of any such claims, demands or pendency of any such action, be notified in writing by said Village Council or by the Mayor or the Village Clerk and the said The Scioto Valley Traction Company shall have the right and opportunity, to conduct the defence or negotiations for the settlement for any or all claims, demands or actions.

Section 4. Said The Scioto Valley Traction Company, their successors and assigns, further agree and contract with said village of Amanda that they will sell, after the distributing system provided for in the ordinance is in operation and during the continuance of this franchise, electrical energy to citizens and people and corporations of said Village, for commercial and domestic lighting and for small or intermittent service motors and heating appliances, at not more than ten cents per one thousand watt-hours, with a minimum monthly charge of not to exceed seventy-five cents for residence service and not to exceed seventy-five cents per kilowatt of connected load for commercial service.

Ordinance # 69

Granting to the Scioto Valley Traction Co of Columbus Ohio, their successors and assigns, the right to use the streets, lanes, alleys, sidewalks and other public ways and places within the incorporated Village of Amanda, Ohio, to construct and maintain and operate an electric lighting and power distributing system as hereafter provided.

Be it Ordained by the Council of the Incorporated Village of Amanda Fairfield Co Ohio,

Sec I That the Scioto Valley Traction Co, Their successors and assigns are hereby granted the privilege and invested with the right for a period of Twenty Five (25) years from and after the passage of this Ordinance, to use the streets, lanes, alleys, sidewalks and other public ways and places of the incorporated Village of Amanda, Ohio. To erect and maintain such poles, frames, towers, wires, cables, lines, lamps, transformers and other appliances as may be necessary for the transmission, transformation and utilization of electrical energy and the operation and maintenance of electrical circuits and the furnishing of electrical energy for light, power and heat for the public and private use in the buildings and otherwise in said Village. The rights and privileges set forth herein are granted and given under and upon the conditions named in this and the following sections.

Sec II That nothing contained in this Ordinance shall release or relieve the said The Scioto Valley Traction Co their successors and assigns, from compliance with all the general Ordinances relating to the use of the streets, lanes, alleys, sidewalks, and public ways and places of the said incorporated Village of Amanda, Ohio. All poles shall be set in so far as is practicable on or near curb and property lines and all wires shall have standard triple braid waterproof insulation and all poles, wires and guy anchors shall be so located and arranged as not to interfere with traffic and shall be made as sightly as is practicable.

Sec III Said The Scioto Traction Co, Their successors and assigns shall hold the Village of Amanda Ohio harmless as against all damages for personal or other injuries that may result from or grow out of the construction, operation or maintenance of said electrical Over

distributing system, provided the said The Scioto Valley Traction Co, their successors and assigns, shall be forthwith and within ten days from the filing any such claims, demands or judgments of any such action, be notified in writing by said Village Council, or by the Mayor or the Village Clerk and the said The Scioto Valley Traction Co, shall have the right and opportunity to conduct the defense or negotiations for the settlement for any or all claims, demands or actions.

Sec IV Said The Scioto Traction Co, Their successors and assigns further agree and contract the said Village of Amanda Ohio that they will sell, after the distributing system provided for in the Ordinance is in operation and during the continuance of the franchise, electrical energy to citizens and people and co-operation of said Village for commercial and domestic lighting and for small or intermittent service motor and heating appliances, at not more than 10% Percent per 1000, one thousand watt hours, with a minimum monthly charge of not to exceed seventy 70 cents for residential service and not to exceed seventy 75 cents per kilo-watt of capacity for commercial service. Said The Scioto Valley Traction Co, Their successors and assigns, further agree to sell electrical energy, as aforesaid, for industrial power service at not more than 5¢ per one thousand watt hours, with a minimum monthly charge of not to exceed seventy 75 cents per kilo-watt of capacity load.

Sec V The rights, privileges and franchise granted by this Ordinance are for a period of twenty five 25 years from date of the passage of this Ordinance, provided however, that The Scioto Valley Traction Co, Their successors and assigns, may at their option and upon six months written notice terminate this franchise and all rights, obligations, and requirements of the said The Scioto Valley Traction Co, their successors and assigns, thereunder.

Sec VI This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force on and after its passage and legal publication and the filing by the said Scioto Valley Traction Co with the Clerk of said Village,

Sec III.

Said Electric Traction Co, their successors and assigns,
 shall be prepared and ready to furnish electrical energy
 to at least ten (10) consumers on or before Jan 1st 1920. If

 with the terms of this section, this Ordinance shall be-
